



How to use Morse code

Morse code is a way of sending messages using dots and dashes that represent letters of the alphabet. It is named after Samual Morse, an American inventor who helped develop it back in the 18 30s.

Morse code can be sent as a series of sounds or even as flashes of light. By switching your torch on and off, you could send messages in the dark to a friend.

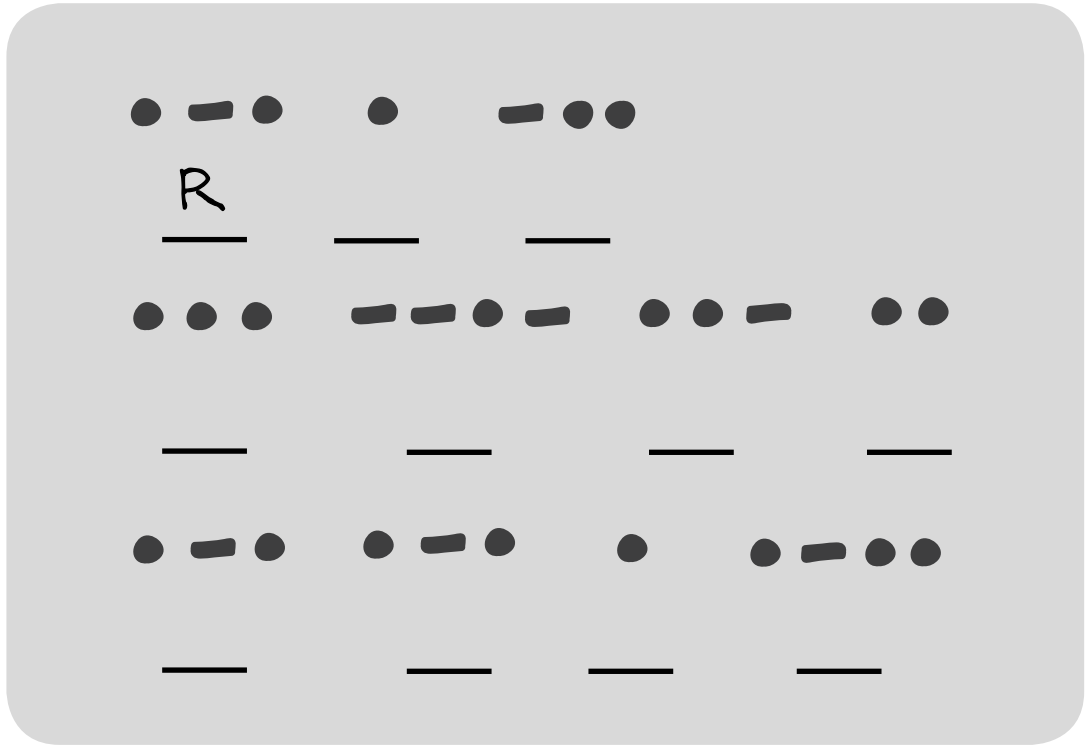
A dot is a short flash of light (about a second long).
A dash is a longer flash (around three seconds long).

Can you decode these messages?

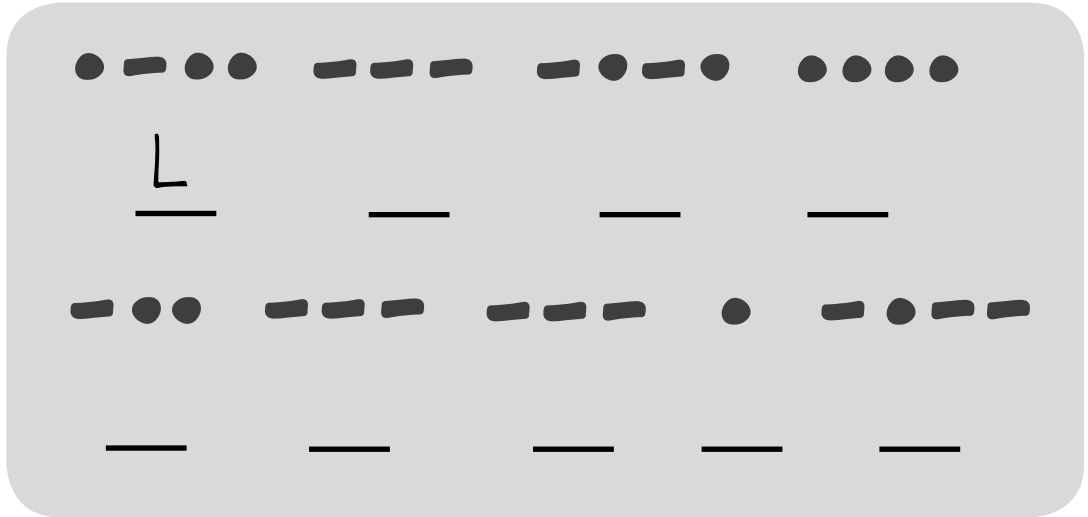
This is the Morse code alphabet. Grab a notebook and a pencil, and decode these Animal Adventure Club words.
